

Play tips and ideas...






Children of this age learn lots of new words; the more you talk and sing to them the more they will learn! They will start to play alongside other children more confidently and be able to concentrate for longer. You might notice that your child is starting to co-ordinate and control their movements more and they may start to enjoy pretend play.

Provide your child with mark making opportunities - this could be chunky crayons, paints or sand!

Push and pull toys, puzzles and blocks will help them to develop their co-ordination skills






Provide opportunities for your child to make dens and boxes to play imaginatively with - a sheet, blanket or cardboard box can provide hours of fun!
